

Prof. Dr. Markus Müschen

Born 1972 in Bonn, Markus Müschen completed medical school in Düsseldorf, Nantes and Paris, France. After clinical training with Volker Diehl in Cologne and postdoctoral fellowships with Janet Rowley in Chicago and Ralf Küppers and Klaus Rajewsky in Cologne, Markus Müschen was awarded an Emmy-Noether grant from the Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft in 2001 to start his independent laboratory in 2001. In 2004, he was appointed professor (C3) with tenure in Düsseldorf and moved with his entire group to Los Angeles in 2006 to build a translational research program as the Director of the Leukemia and Lymphoma Program of the University of Southern California and Children's Hospital Los Angeles. In 2010, he joined the University of California San Francisco (UCSF) as full professor and currently serves as Co-Leader of the Hematological Malignancies Program at the UCSF Comprehensive Cancer Center. Markus Müschen is a Scholar of the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society, a Senior Investigator of the Wellcome Trust and recipient of the 2015 NCI 'Outstanding Investigator Award'. His research at UCSF involves multi-disciplinary approaches (Immunology, cancer biology, signal transduction, computational biology) and has a genuine translational focus towards development of pathway-specific drug-design for patients with B cell malignancies.
